<b>Organise the Menu Area – Using suitable background colour, sub headings and dividers</b>		
<b>Use of Banners for easier navigation</b>		
<b>Text is in a clear readable format and font e.g Verdana, 12</b>		
<b><u>Colour Coding</u></b> <b>Use of good dyslexia friendly background – Light pastel colours such blue or yellow for main text</b> <b>Heading and Sub-headings differentiated</b> <b>Readings provided in a light pastel blue colour</b> <b>Providing information on activities in a different colour</b>		
<b>Visual Images support text and are clear and easily identified</b>		
<b>Providing materials to bring to face to face sessions in violet blue easier to differentiate</b>		
<b>The use of learning module to create content and embedding discussion boards within the learning module</b>		
<b>Embedding materials within the course page</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Videos embedded within the course pages</b></li> <li>• <b>Powerpoints (Slideshare) – Attachment given for offline viewing</b></li> <li>• <b>Course Handbooks (Issuu)</b></li> </ul>		
<b>Provided offline materials in PDF</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Renders easily on mobile</b></li> </ul>		
<b>Provide documents and attachments in PDF unless it needs editing. This opens in a new window for easier navigation. PDF allows text to be read back to them.</b>		
<b>Using a clear description for Alt Text - Alt text defines what this image is for a visually impaired or blind user using assistive technology, such as screen readers. All image and multimedia files should have alt text associated with them.</b>		
<b>Providing direct links to materials on the library catalogue, abstract and images linking to the material</b>		
<b>Providing podcasts to support the auditory learner</b>
