Provide documents and attachments in PDF unless it needs editing. This opens in a new window for easier navigation. PDF allows text to be read back to them.		
Using a clear description for Alt Text - Alt text defines what this image is for a visually impaired or blind user using assistive technology, such as screen readers. All image and multimedia files should have alt text associated with them.		
Providing direct links to materials on the library catalogue, abstract and images linking to the material
