Grow Your Academic Resilience	<p>Introduction to the tools students need to help nurture their academic resilience and feel confident dealing with feedback:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What it means to be academically resilient • The difference between a 'fixed and 'growth' mindset • Practical tools to nurture resilience and deal confidently with academic studies 	All students	60 mins

Writing a Critical Reflection on Practice	<p>Support to identify and analyse a critical incident and reflect on its relevance to professional development in an assignment: An introduction to strategies to help them illustrate critical reflection throughout assignments.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The value of undertaking a critical reflection • How reflective writing differs from the 'traditional' essay • Brief overview of different models of reflection • Drawing links between practice, theory and literature 	Students who are required to critically reflect on an aspect of their professional practice or placement	60 mins
Planning a Dissertation	<p>Support to plan, research, and structure a dissertation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Keeping a narrow focus and the importance of originality • Refining your title • Structure and function of each section of a dissertation and similarities with research articles 	3rd Year / PGT students embarking on a dissertation	60 mins
Presentation Skills	<p>Support to plan, practise, and perfect presentations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Importance of planning a presentation • Techniques for presenting with confidence • Ways of structuring an academic presentation • Consideration of accessible and visually appealing formatting 	Any student due to deliver presentations	60 mins
