REF2 open access

REF2: associated & attributed authors & co-authorship

• Which REF1s are associated & attributed to each REF2 record, and the total number of internal authors on the output in Pure.

REF2: peer comments

• The grade predicted by the UoA, peer reviewer names, reviewers' grades and comments, the REF2 selection status for the UoA, its Pure workflow status, and the number of associated and attributed REF1s (staff).

REF1: REF2 associations & attributions

• The number of REF2s associated with and attributed to each REF1 record, and each REF1's inclusion status on the submission.

 - o Number of allowed non-compliant outputs attributed
 - o GPA
 - o Number locked attribution
- REF1 level
 - o FTE
 - o Number attributed/non-attributed REF2 in the pool divided by predicted grade
 - o GPA
