The most common example is a light coloured text on a dark background. Contrast issues vary and Blackboard, Ally does provide some feedback. However, here are some of the best practices that you can apply that will reduce the likelihood of this accessibility error. Always make sure that there is strong contrast between the text and the background colour of a page, black text on a white background is standard for good reason. Try to avoid background images or colours or patterns on text. Text is very difficult to read on these backgrounds. Make sure your photos and other images are clear, well composed and well focused. Try to consider how students with colourblindness might see an image or text on a page. Avoid colour combinations that those users might find difficult to distinguish.
