

What is PsycInfo?

PsycInfo is a database containing more than 2 million citations and summaries of scholarly journal articles, book chapters and dissertations in psychology related disciplines. The majority of the material covered in this database is peer reviewed. PsycInfo is not a full text database but it is possible to link to the full text article if the University has a subscription.

How do I access PsycInfo?

- Like all our electronic resources, PsycInfo can be accessed via the Library Catalogue.
- Enter 'PsycInfo' in the search box, choose 'Electronic Library' from the right drop-down menu and click 'Submit'.
- Connect to the database by clicking on the link in the centre of the screen.

How do I search PsycInfo?
