

What is Film and Television Literature Index with full text?

This database contains full text articles from over 100 journals. Subject coverage includes film & television theory, preservation & restoration, writing, production, cinematography, technical aspects, and reviews.

How do I access Film and Television Literature?

- Like all our electronic resources, this database can be accessed via the Library Catalogue.
- Enter '**Film and Television Literature**' in the search box, choose 'Electronic Library' from the right drop-down menu and click 'Search'.
- Connect to the database by clicking on the link in the centre of the screen.

How do I search Film and Television Literature?

Use the **Search modes** to tailor your search.

Enter your key words in the **search box**.
