

What are JSTOR Collections?

JSTOR Collections is an archive of over one thousand of the highest-quality academic journals across the humanities, social sciences, and sciences, as well as monographs and other materials valuable for academic work. The journal runs are complete however there is usually a delay of 3-5 years between the current volume of the journal and the latest volume available on JSTOR.

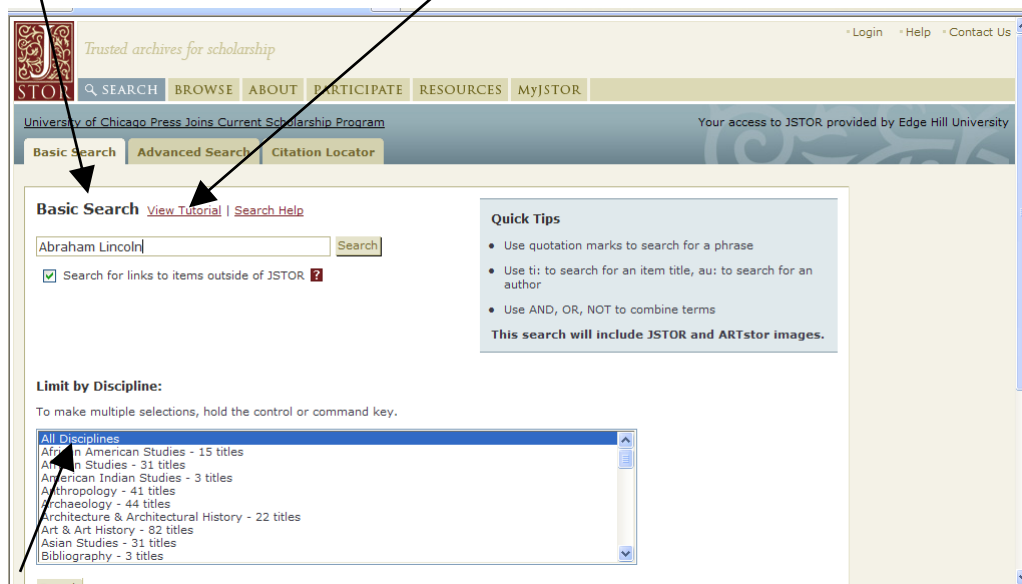
How do I access JSTOR Collections?

- Like all our electronic resources, JSTOR Collections can be accessed via the Library Catalogue.
- Enter 'JSTOR Collections' in the search box, choose 'Electronic Library' from the right drop-down menu and click 'search'.
- Connect to the database by clicking on the link in the centre of the screen.

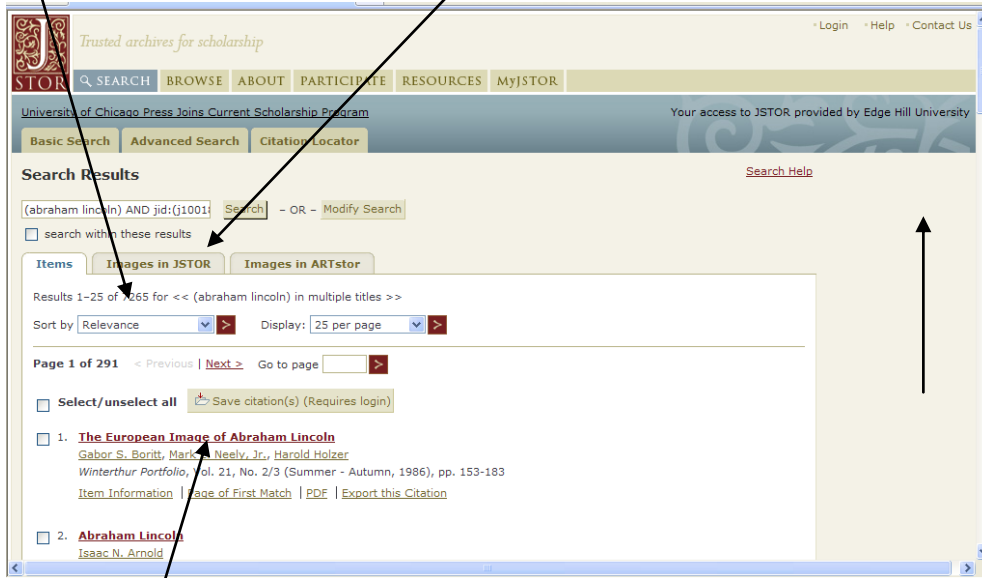
