

## What is the International Bibliography of Theatre and Dance

This database contains more than 450 full-text titles, including more than 140 full-text journals, and more than 300 full-text books & monographs. It is the definitive research tool for the study of theatre and the performing arts.

## How do I access this database?

- Like all our electronic resources, this database can be accessed via the Library Catalogue.
- Type '**International database of Theatre and Dance**' in the search box, choose 'Electronic Library' from the right drop-down menu and click 'Search'.
- Connect to the database by clicking on the link in the centre of the screen.
