

What is Project Muse?

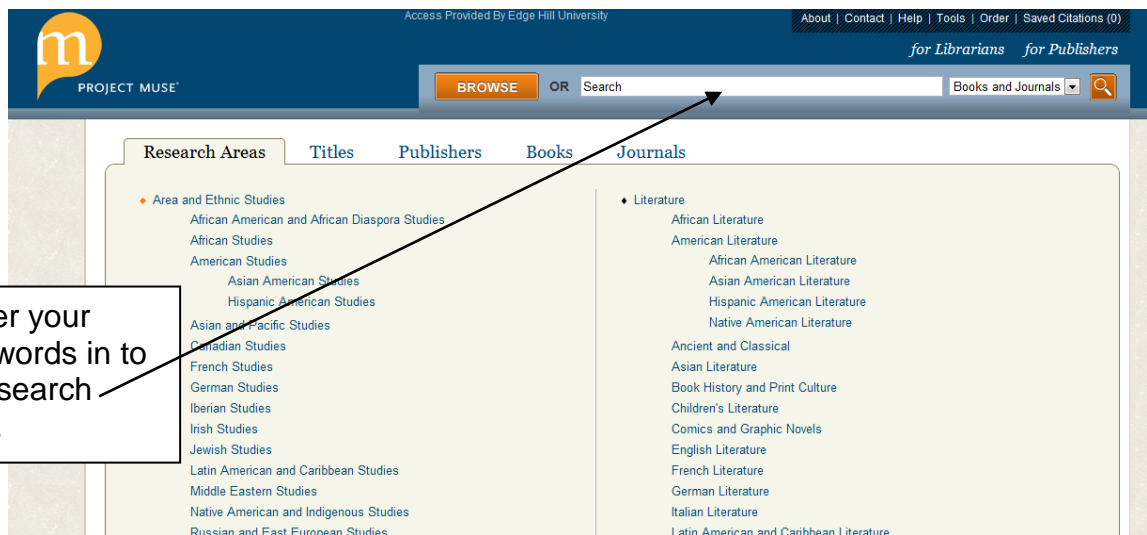
Project Muse – The Humanities Collection is made up of 167 journals. Use it to find full text journal articles.
