
Finding Journals for your Course

To view the recommended journals for your course, go to the <u>Library Catalogue</u>.



Then type your module code in the search box and press enter.



Type your module code into the search box.

All the items that are on this reading list will then appear. The list can contains both titles of books and journals. Some reading lists also have digitised items, which are usually a chapter of a book or an article, which you can access in full text whilst you are studying a particular module.


Finding Journals for your Subject

You can access journal articles in a number of ways. It may be that Learning Services have a print subscription, in which case you need to search on the library catalogue, to see if we have the particular title, volume and issue you require, and then locate the printed copy of the journal on the shelves.


It is very likely that the library has an electronic subscription to the journal you are after.

Health / nursing / midwifery / social work / counselling / operating department practice etc.

Use any of the above terms as a keyword to search on the library catalogue.



You will see that there are lots of journals covering different aspects of your subject area.



To put your results into alphabetical order, according to title, simply click on the 'title' link just

Finding Printed Journals

Information about print journal holdings and the location in which they are held can be found in the Library catalogue.

If you want to see whether we subscribe to a particular journal go to the library catalogue web page.

- Type the title of the journal into the search box.
- · Press enter.

Most journals are housed on the first floor of the University Library, however, some Law journals may be located on the second floor with the law collection.

Some of our older journals may be kept in the University Library journals store. Ask a member of staff for assistance if required.

Inter Library Loans

If you need an item which is not in stock in any of our libraries, and is not available via our electronic resources, you may request an Inter Library Loan.

The Inter Library Loan service allows you to access materials that we do not currently hold.

We will do our best to obtain it for you through either the national or international inter-library loan network.


If you are a member of staff, researcher, postgraduate, or undergraduate, you are eligible to use the Inter Library Loans Service.
