### **Finding Journals for your Course**

To view the recommended journals for your course, go to the <u>Library Catalogue</u>.

- Click on the drop down menu on the left-hand side of the page and select 'Module Code' from the list. ('Keyword' is the default)
- Type your module code with no spaces into the search box.
- Click on the drop down menu on the right-hand side of the page and select 'all Journals'.
- (The default choice is 'View Entire Collection')
- Click on 'Submit' or press enter.

The results will be the recommended journals for your course.

## Finding Journals for your Subject

Search the Library Catalogue for all journals relating to:

Health / nursing / midwifery / social work / counselling / operating department practice etc.

Use any of the above terms as a keyword to search on.

• Select 'All journals' from the drop-down menu to the right of the search box.

You will see that there are lots of journals covering different aspects of your subject area.

To put your results into alphabetical order, according to title, simply click on the 'title' link just to the right of the search box.



View recommended journal collections and journal databases on your subject web pages.

#### **Finding Printed Journals**

Information about print journal holdings and the location in which they are held can be found in the Library catalogue.

If you want to see whether we subscribe to a particular journal go to the library catalogue web page.

• Click on the drop down menu on the left-hand side of the page and select 'Title' from the list. ('Keyword' is the default)

- Type the title of the journal into the search box.
- Click on the drop down menu on the right-hand side of the search box and select 'All Journals'. (The default choice is 'View Entire Collection')
- Click on 'Submit' or press enter.

Most journals are housed on the first floor of the University Library, however, some Law journals may be located on the second floor with the law collection.

Some of our older journals may be kept in the University Library journals store. Ask a member of staff for assistance if required.

# **Inter Library Loans**

If you need an item which is not in stock in any of our libraries, and is not available via our electronic resources, you may request an Inter Library Loan.

The Inter Library Loan service allows you to access materials that we do not currently hold.

We will do our best to obtain it for you through either the national or international inter-library loan network.

If you are a member of staff, researcher, postgraduate, or undergraduate, you are eligible to use the Inter Library Loans Service.

You can ask for almost any sort of printed materials:

- Books
- Journal articles
- Conference proceedings
- Theses
- Reports
- Book chapters
- Whole issues of journals

### Finding eBooks for your Course

To view the recommended eBooks for your course, go to the library catalogue

- Click on the drop down menu on the left-hand side of the page and select 'Module Code' from the list. ('Keyword' is the default)
- Type your module code with no spaces into the search box.
- Click on the drop down menu on the right-hand side of the page and select Electronic Library'. (The default choice is 'View Entire Collection')
- Click on 'Submit' or press enter.

The results will be the recommended eBooks and online materials for your course. Also try searching our <u>eBooks collections</u>, we have over 100,000 eBooks in our four main collections.
