

What is Web of Science?

Web of Science provides access to four extensive bibliographic databases covering Science, Social Sciences, Arts and Humanities. This is not a full text database however, bibliographic details are provided and there is the opportunity to link to the full text article if the University has a subscription.

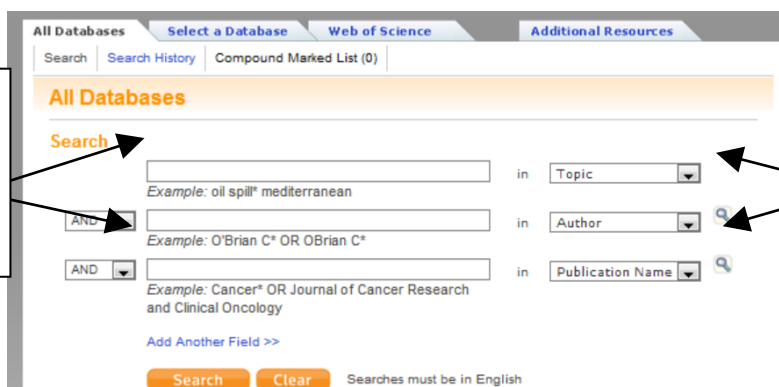
How do I access Web of Science?

- Like all our electronic resources, Web of Science can be accessed via the Library Catalogue.
- Enter 'Web of Science' in the search box, choose 'Electronic Library' from the right drop-down menu and click 'Submit'.
- Connect to the database by clicking on 'Website'.
- Click on the 'Click here to access WEB OF KNOWLEDGE' button.

In the **Current Limits** area you can specify a publication date range and the databases you wish to search.

Number of search results

Click on article title to view abstract

Refine results further, as necessary

Click on 'Context sensitive links' and the database will check the catalogue to see if the article can be viewed in Full Text
